Bandura's social learning theory starts from evolved assumption that we can learn by observing others. Key processes during this type of learning are observation, imitation, and modeling which as such involve attention, memory, and motivation 4). People learn through observing others' behavior, attitudes, and outcomes of those behaviors.
