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Document Based Question Tips

The Document-Based Question (DBQ) on the AP U.S. History Exam presents you with six or seven documents that all relate to a particular event/time and ask you to create an argument around them. Those familiar with what the DBQ entails might also know that you're welcome to choose whatever argument you want — as long as you can support it.

3 Tips for the AP U.S. History Document-Based Question ...

While reading the prompt, try to: Understand the question Identify the keywords, such as the time period, society, cultural and economic problems Identify the evidence you need to extract from the documents Think out of the box

Document-Based Questions, or DBQ essays, are often used in social studies classes to test your ability to do historical work rather than simply memorize facts. Start by spending some time reviewing the documents and developing an argument.

How to Write a DBQ

Students in Jennifer Gilrein's World History class give each other feedback on their Document-Based Questions. Before sharing their DBQs with peers, students set goals to focus the feedback they will solicit. Jennifer encourages students to use the AP DBQ rubric to guide their goal setting and feedback. Students then work together to give each other warm and cool feedback on each others' essays.

How To Write Document Based Questions Lesson

create a strong thesis and support that thesis with the aid of the documents provided. analyze sources for characteristics such as author's point of view, the author's purpose, the audience, and context. make connections between the documents. bring in outside knowledge to strengthen the argument.

What is a DBQ? The Document-Based Question Explained

*Read the documents carefully and answer the questions (These additional questions will help you think critically about the topics). *Each document may have 1-3 questions that follow that you must answer before writing the essay. *These questions will help get you thinking about how to shape your essay and will help in writing the thesis statement.

How To Answer A Document Based Question

The DBQ requires you to analyze the documents in addition to bringing outside information to bear on the question. This is a difficult task, and you have only 15 minutes to plan before you begin writing. Don't panic! Use the same strategies given for the LEQ for document analysis. The more you practice using these strategies, the better you ...

5 Tips for Writing a Great DBQ Essay

Surprisingly common mistakes can be avoided by reading the question two or three times. Especially with a DBQ, re-read the last few sentences to understand exactly what the question is asking. This allows you as a student to stay on topic and write a convincing argument in your essay. - Develop a thesis statement.
