Archaeological evidence from Lakeba shows that cannibalism was common in Fiji from over 2,500 years ago, with butchered human bones being common in food waste middens up until the mid-1800s. By 1800 cannibalism was a normal and ritualized part of life, integral to Fijian religion and warfare.
