A reading guide is simply a list of suggested topics for discussion, most often created by the publisher. Useful discussion questions Focus on a small set of questions (e.g. 2-3 per paper) that will help steer the class to the points you find most interesting and useful about the article. These might include questions such as:! What point was the author trying to make? Did he/she make his point?

Building Guiding Questions Now frame a guiding question that addresses both the performance and content standards. Also, make sure you ask questions that have many possible answers and require research and analysis. "What invention had the biggest effect in the Civil War?"
