Cogito, ergo sum is a philosophical statement that was made in Latin by René Descartes, usually translated into English as "I think, therefore I am". The phrase originally appeared in French as je pense, donc je suis in his Discourse on the Method, so as to reach a wider audience than Latin would have allowed. "I Think, Therefore I am" is used in most intro classes to get across the real meaning of what the cogito (Meditation II) means — A deceiver can't deceive me of my existence, for if he were I wouldn't exist! Although, the true quote comes from Descartes Discourse on Method, it is easier to explain it with this example.

Descartes also saw very clearly that all truths were linked with one another, so that finding a fundamental truth and proceeding with logic would open the way to all science. Descartes discovered this basic truth quite soon: his famous "I think, therefore I am." France. In 1620 Descartes left the army.

The idea that "I think, therefore I am" affirms the consequent is enticing, because it does seem that if you state "Bob thinks," you thereby imply "Bob exists." If you are trying to demonstrate that Bob exists, this is a poor way to do it.

The phrase "I think, therefore I am" or " Cogito ergo sum " might make Descartes the most-quoted philosopher of the last 400

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years. The Frenchman's theory—if I am thinking, I must also be existing—is foundational to modern philosophy. For Descartes, the Cogito formed the foundation of all other knowledge: in the depths of Meditations, as he doubts everything, the Cogito is the one truth of which Descartes is sure.
