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Neonatal And Pediatric Critical Care

The neonatal and pediatric critical care codes are not time based but rather are reported per calendar day for the evaluation and management of a neonatal or pediatric patient. The codes are selected based on: Initial visit and subsequent days; Age and/or birth weight (for neonates) These codes can be reported only in the inpatient setting.

Pediatric critical care codes are reported per day. If a provider from the same group or specialty rounds on the patient later in the day, he or she cannot bill another critical care code for a patient younger than 5 years of age. The applicable code sets include: Neonatal critical care 28 days or younger

Background: Most children die in neonatal and pediatric intensive care units after decisions are made to withhold or withdraw life-sustaining treatments. These decisions can be challenging when there are different views about the child's best interest and when there is a lack of clarity about how best to also consider the interests of the family.

Objective: To quantify moral distress in neonatal ICU and PICU clinicians and to identify associated factors.. Depersonalization was assessed on the subscale of the Maslach Burnout Inventory.
