Polymer banknotes are banknotes made from a synthetic polymer such as 28BOPP.29[biaxially oriented polypropylene (BOPP)]. Such notes incorporate many security features not available in paper banknotes, including the use of metameric inks. Polymer banknotes last significantly longer than paper notes, causing a decrease in environmental impact and a reduced cost of production and replacement.
