He clarifies, "the communicative model of action does not equate action with communication. Language is a medium of communication that serves understanding, whereas actors, in coming to an understanding with one another so as to coordinate their actions, pursue their particular aims.

In the theory of communicative action, that means only spontaneous actions that are beyond the influence of steering media would have any value. For Habermas, that meant concepts of love, creativity, and charisma. Steering media can only be influential within a lifeworld if four specific things happen.

Habermas' Theory of Communicative Action

Communicative action is the underlying theory in which communicative power and communicative reason/rationality refine themselves. Communicative power is the influence that citizens exert upon a state through rational discussions of their interests and values.
