In other words, the British saw the American colonists as tenants who 'paid rent' by providing materials for Britain to use. According to the beliefs at the time, the wealth of the world was fixed. To increase a country's wealth, leaders needed to either explore and expand or conquer wealth through conquest.

### **Mercantilism and Its Effect on Colonial America**

The majority of African countries joined as Commonwealth Realms, later converting to Commonwealth Republics. Two countries, Lesotho and Swaziland, joined as Kingdoms. British Somaliland (which joined with Italian Somaliland five days after gaining independence in 1960 to form Somalia), and Anglo-British Sudan (which became a republic in 1956) did not become members of the Commonwealth of Nations.
